Annual Report Analytics

Help Document: “Reviewing Annual Report Analytics”

The Annual Report Analytic Dashboards in PharmAcademic displays each program's survey responses to key questions from the ASHP Annual Residency Accreditation Report from the last 5 years and compares those responses with aggregate data from similar programs.

Topics include:

- Applicants vs. Available Positions
- Resident Completion Rate
- Preceptor and Resident Count
- Resident Projects Resulting in Institutional Change
- Percentage of Residents Taking Positions Requiring Residency Training

File Storage Upgrade

All files housed in PharmAcademic have been moved to an updated file storage system. Users will not see any changes on the pages.

Added Updated PGY1 Entering Self-Assessment Forms to PGY1 Programs

The updated forms were added to PGY1 Pharmacy, PGY1 Community-Based Pharmacy, and PGY1 Managed Care Pharmacy on the resident's Self-Assessment & Development Plans tab.

Update the Word “Graduate” to “Complete” Throughout PharmAcademic

The word “graduate” has been removed and replaced with a version of the word “complete” in PharmAcademic. These edits were made in the following places:

- Residents tab
- Residents Program tab
- Graduate Tracking pages
- Program Reports
- Resident Closeout pages

Note: The word “graduate” will be removed from annual surveys during each survey's yearly review/update.

Remove Ability for Residents to be Preceptors

Help Document: “Adding and Updating Preceptors and Staff”

If an RPD/Designee tries to add some on the Preceptor and Staff tab who is currently a resident in PharmAcademic, they will not be able to continue, but they will see the following message:

“This person cannot be a preceptor because they are a resident in PharmAcademic. Please refer to the ASHP Guidance document for preceptor qualifications.”

Survey Email

Email text was updated in emails that are sent after a survey is scheduled.

To practitioner surveyors:

- Removal of the word “on-site” to refer to the upcoming survey
- Changed the word “guest” to “practitioner”

New language in email sent to programs:

ASHP Surveyors have been granted access to your residency program in PharmAcademic. They can view information in PharmAcademic, but they cannot make any changes. The surveyors will use this information to prepare for the site visit and for their final report. They will have access to your program until the review is complete and the findings are presented to the Commission on Credentialing (COC). You will still need to send all the attachments outlined in the Pre-survey Materials Packet.
